ICEBREAKER

"Navigating Faith Together"

Instructions:

1. Distribute a pen and a piece of paper to each member.

- 2. Ask everyone to write their name on the paper and answer the following questions in bullet points:
- Describe a moment when a question about Christianity challenged you.
- Share a Bible verse or Christian teaching that has significantly impacted your life.
- What resource (book, person, sermon, etc.) has helped you answer tough questions about your faith?
- Share a topic or question about Christianity you hope to explore with this group.
- How do you hope this group will help you grow in your faith
- 3. Collect the papers and shuffle them.
- 4. Distribute one paper to each member, ensuring no one receives their own paper.
- 5. Give them 5 minutes to read the answers and reflect on the shared experiences and expectations.
- 6. After 5 minutes, invite volunteers to share the responses on the sheet they received, and guess who may have written it.
- 7. The person whose answers are being shared can stand up and share any additional thoughts if they wish.

Purpose: The aim of this icebreaker is to create a supportive atmosphere where members can openly share and explore tough questions about Christianity together, getting to know each other's faith journey and expectations from the LifeGroup.

Equipping ourselves to engage in discussions and answer questions about Christianity is an enriching endeavor that not only adheres to scriptural encouragement but also fosters personal growth and building community.

- o <u>Prayer</u> (leads group prayer and sends out weekly prayer requests)
- o <u>Micro-Mission</u> (helps coordinate a group service project)
