Dear Church Family,

A few years back, we made the ultra-challenging decision to become debt free – not so that we could sit back and coast – but so that we could lean forward and engage our mission like never before. Looking back on 2019, I am honored to report that we have stayed the course, and are setting up the church for sustainable, exponential effectiveness that, I believe, will outlive everyone reading this annual report. With God's help, we have made great strides toward this goal, without skimping on the important work that God has for us right now. If you've been around New Hope in 2019, then you know we added services and changed service times around. The most notable addition has been the Thursday night service at every campus. This service has continued to remain strong, giving those who can't attend on the weekend a place to call home. It's the first time our Webster Campus & Friendswood Campus have had a weekday option. It's also the first time that ALL of our campuses are in sync at their first service. And I love it!! It has increased our capacity without an exorbitant price tag. We've also added time between services on Sunday morning. This minor change has helped in a major way, as people enter and exit our campuses.

Here are a few notable financial victories I wanted to share...

- We raised over \$90,000 for the Refuge for Women; \$33,000 for the Beltway 8 South Crisis Pregnancy Center; \$25,000 for Youth for Christ; Nearly \$17,000 for mission work in Haiti via FAME. Over \$10,000 to support Camp Hope & the PTSD Foundation of America; Over \$10,000 to Operation Finally Home for injured Vets; Over \$10,000 to be used toward Veteran Counseling for those Vets who are part of our church family. Over \$10,000 to Samaritan's Purse for those affected by the Cyclone in Mozambique.
- We paid off the debt of our 288 Campus.
- We paid off the debt of our Alvin Campus

We also had record attendances, record number of kids going to camp, etc. Hundreds of people baptized in 2019. All this and much MORE, while God continues to move us toward what's next. I can't wait.

I want you to know that we're very intentional about using the resources God provides to accomplish the mission He has for us. I've been doing this a long time, and yet I'm more excited now about our potential to reach people for Jesus than ever before!

Thank you, Lord. And to the givers of New Hope: Thanks for being a part of what God is doing and will do!

LIFEGROUPS

What a blessing 2019 was in our LifeGroup ministry! We started 56 FPU LifeGroups, and 41 LifeGroups totaling 97 New LifeGroups in 2019. Additionally, more than 800 people were connected to LifeGroups this year! Our LifeGroups are not just meeting, but they are also serving together. Some groups fed homeless families, others visited and ministered in nursing homes, while some groups even went overseas to countries like Haiti to share the love of Jesus.

Our groups take to heart NHC's mission statement "To **KNOW** Christ, and to make Him **KNOWN**!" Also, 178 people jumped in to become members, and are continuing their journey to becoming full devoted followers of Christ!

NEW HOPE KIDS

AVERAGE ATTENDANCE: 1421 PER WEEK IN 2019

Hope Kids, New Hope's Special Needs ministry, participated in 2 Hope Kids Parents' Night Out opportunities that gives parents a time to invest in themselves and allows their students to be cared for by our team.

New Hope Kids succeeded in partnering with New Hope Church in it's first ever New Hope Kids Movie Series to attract families and offer a kid-friendly alternative during the Movie Series.

NHK 170 families partnered with during their Baby Dedication Celebration to journey with them through their child's Christ. Families. Staff and growth in Volunteers had a wonderful opportunity to connect for the first time. May - 109 November - 61 registrants according to ROCK.

NHK Camp traveled with 184 kids to Camp Tejas in our best self-produced camp yet AND partnered again with Living Water International to raise money for 11 new water wells in Africa.

NHK & Krush partnered to connect with and provide breakfast for over 20 local area schools. This led to opportunities for staff from each ministry to connect and serve throughout the school year with local teachers and students.
